

OBERAMMERGAU MUSEUM

The Oberammergau Museum, opened in 1910, has largely retained its authenticity and is one of the oldest, most important and beautiful cultural history museums in Bavaria. Woodcarvings have been produced in Oberammergau for over 500 years. The museum's exquisite collection displays a varied cross-section of artworks and hand-crafted objects from the 17th century to modern times. At experimental tables you yourself can explore the world of timber as a material.

Famous crib scenes — the art lover King Ludwig II even came to admire the Historical Church Nativity Scene — colourfully painted toys, expertly crafted genre carvings, figures of saints, crucifixes and contemporary sculptures have been assembled here to create an overall picture of the artistic expertise and craftsmanship of the region through the centuries. The genuineness of this historical presentation and the charm it exudes are both surprising and impressive, even in comparison to recently built museums. The museum traces the social and economic history as well as the biographies of local artists.

Graceful paper cribs, interesting portraits of a merchant family and small oil paintings by the famous Lüftl painter Franz Seraph Zwink (1748–1792) are on display in the museum. His main work, the impressive frescoes on the outer façade of the Pilatushaus, can be viewed at any time.

In the early history section, 'The Romans in Oberammergau', original finds from a Rhaetian sacrificial site on the Döttenbichl (a hill below the Kofel Mountain) from 100 BC to 50 AD can be seen. Apart from sacrificial offerings made by the local people, these include a number of weapons used by Roman legionaries. These are the oldest, datable Roman finds in Bavaria.

Unfortunately at the moment we can only show 7 of the exhibits from the famous **Oberammergauer Reverse-Painting collection**. The Murnauer brewer Johann Krötz (1858–1919) collected over one thousand of these paintings, largely from the Staffelsee and Oberammergau regions.

The artistic group 'Blauer Reiter' (Blue Rider), above all Wassily Kandinsky, Gabriele Münter and Franz Marc, were inspired by these pictures and in 1912 published them in the almanach 'Der Blaue Reiter'. It is these originals which are exhibited in the publisher's room.

PASSION PLAY THEATRE

The tradition of the world-famous Oberammergau Passion Play began with a vow taken during the Thirty Years' War. At the time of the Swedish invasion, the Black Death, a devastating plague, had reached Bavaria and claimed the lives of more than 80 people in Oberammergau. In 1633, in the hope of gaining God's help, the village councillors vowed to 'perform the tragedy of the Passion every ten years' if the village were spared any further deaths from then onwards. The Plague passed by and, in 1634, the people of Oberammergau fulfilled their vow for the first time. Performances were initially held on a simple wooden structure in the cemetery next to the parish church. The present theatre site has been used for performances since 1830.

The stage, repeatedly remodelled and brought in line with state-of-the-art technology, gained its present appearance in 1930. The some 4500 seats in the auditorium were roofed over in 1900 with an innovative wrought iron lattice construction that ensures a good view of the openair stage from every one of the tiered rows of seats.

The much-praised unity of text, music, stage and costume design certainly owes its origins to the fact that, as woodcarvers with a long tradition, the people of Oberammergau always had a pronounced artistic sense of form and colour.

It is the continuity in performing the play nearly four hundred years now that is unique to Oberammergau and has made the Passion Play the largest and most famous in the world. This huge communal effort is only possible due to the whole village's willingness to re-enact the history of the suffering and death of Jesus of Nazareth every ten years, as a story of hope and redemption for the world.

The history of the Passion Play can be seen in an exhibition in the foyer of the Passion Play Theatre or as part of a guided tour that also includes a look behind the stage.
